

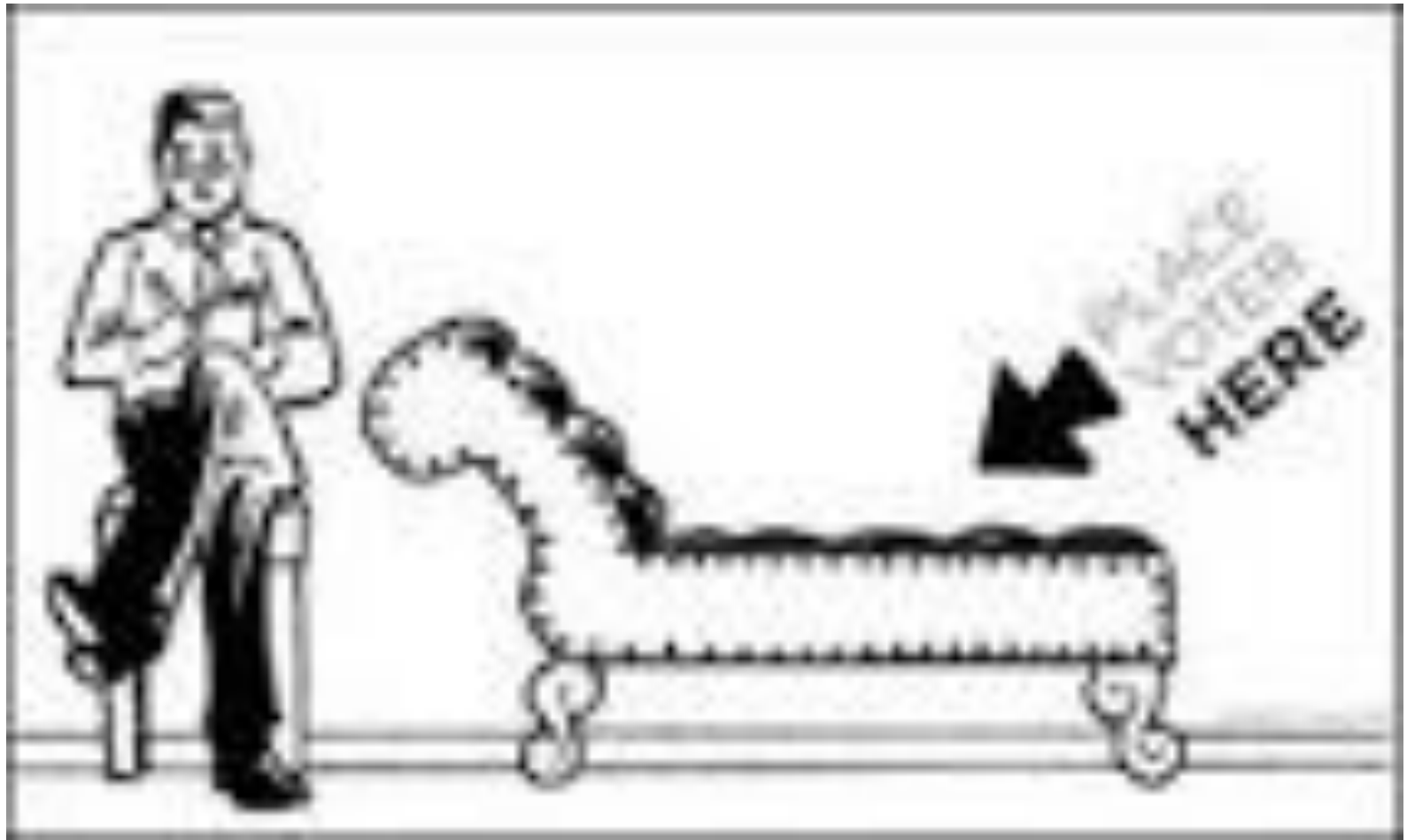

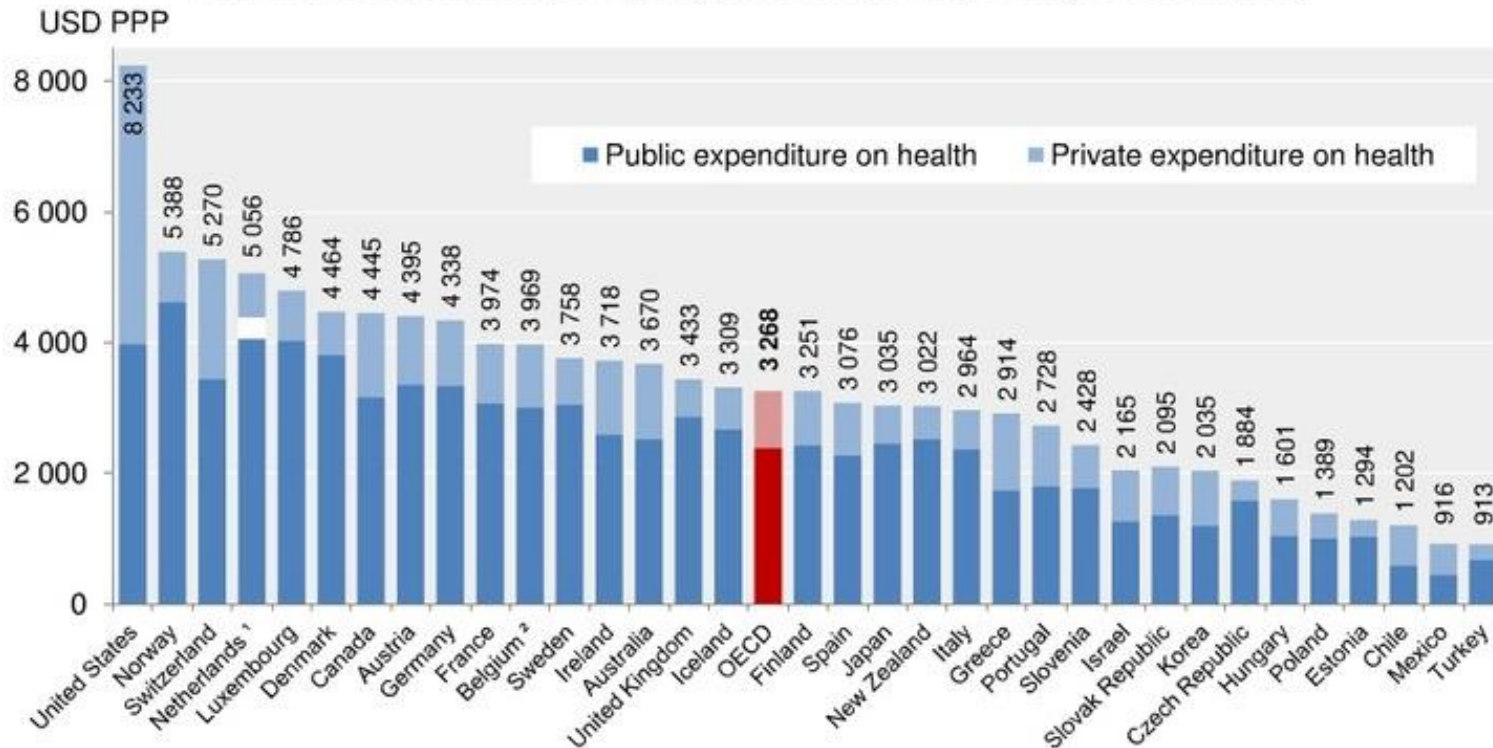
US Healthcare System

2. Total expenditure excluding investments.

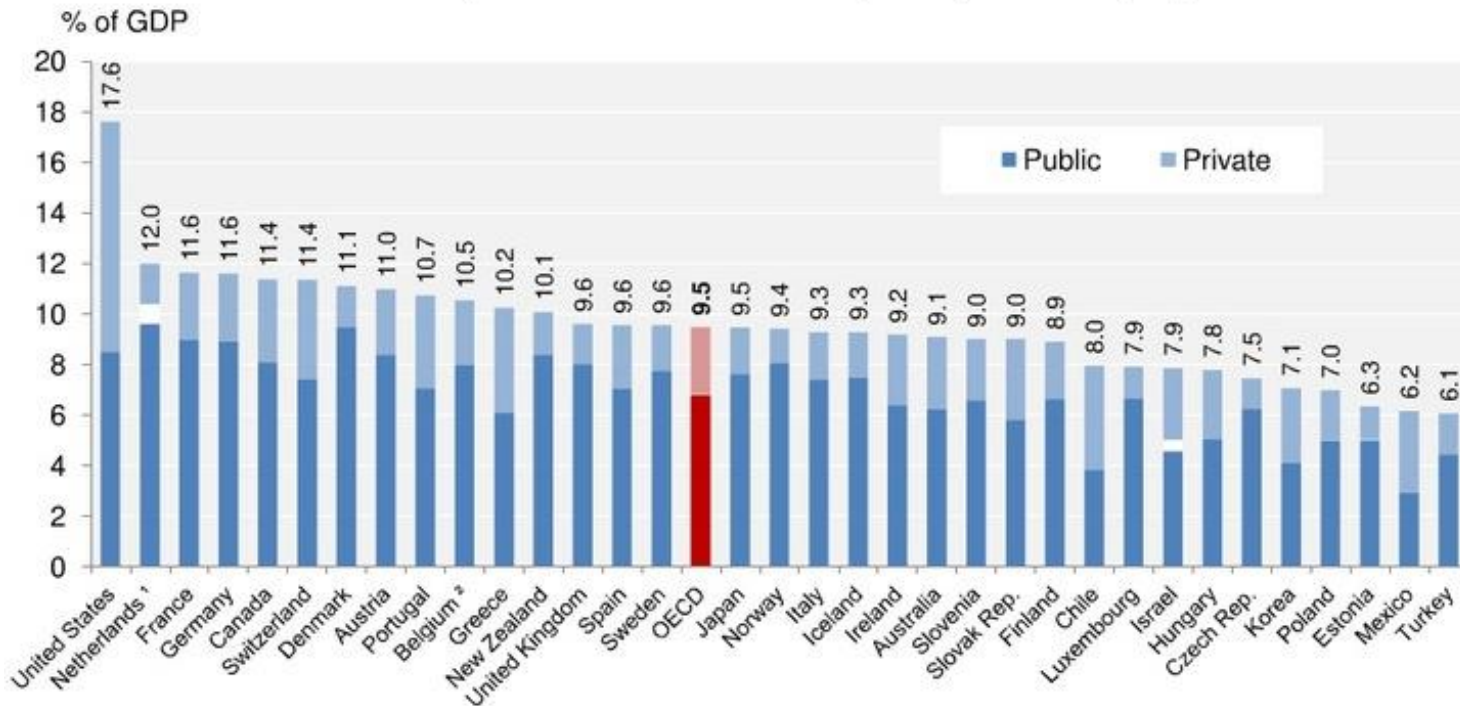

Total health expenditure as a share of GDP, 2010 (or nearest year)



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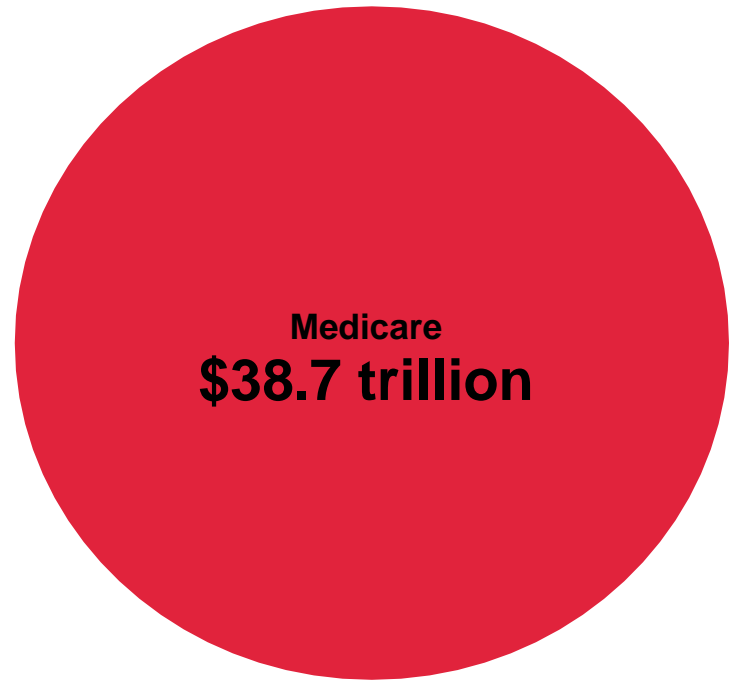
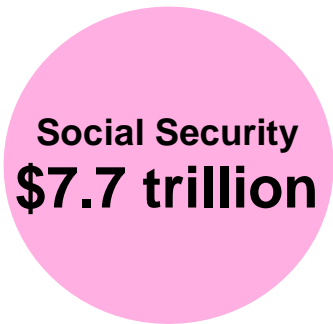
