

Alpine School District Information Sheet

Alpine School District serves over 80,000 students in Utah County.

Social work interns will cover one to two schools and will be responsible for providing individual and group mental health therapy to students, connecting students and families with community resources, accompanying school personnel on home visits, and intervening in crisis situations. Interns will collaborate with school “social and emotional wellbeing teams,” which include school counselors, school psychologists, school nurses, and school social workers.

We are trained mental health professionals who work with students, families, and communities to address their most challenging issues.



We **support** people to cope with and solve problems in their everyday lives.



We **assess** and treat mental, behavioral, and emotional issues.



We are a **link** to community resources for families, schools and other service agencies.



We **champion & advocate** for student rights and vulnerable populations.

Each intern will be paired with a clinical supervisor to meet with weekly. Additionally, there will be monthly group supervisions to allow for collaboration among interns and training in various areas (i.e. suicide assessment, safety planning, play therapy, art in therapy, etc.).

We are looking for interns who are:

- Self-motivated and independent
- Organized and effective communicators
- Interested in social work in the school setting
- Excited to work with children and adolescents

We are currently looking for first and second year MSW students and have four available internship placements.

First year students, completing 450 hours, will receive a stipend amount of \$2700. Second year students, completing 600 hours, will receive a stipend amount of \$6600.
