We offer a broad range of services, from outpatient treatment to inpatient psychiatric hospitalization.

Our behavioral health programs offer a team of professionals to help understand your child and family's unique, individualized needs. We offer a wide range of services to treat your family at the right level of care. We have a variety of services, so if your child's needs increase or decrease, we can modify your treatment plan to accommodate them. In addition to this, we offer several unique resources, including speech therapy, recreational therapy, and occupational therapy. Lastly, we have an Assessment, Referral, and Consultation Service available for families. This is a centralized entry point into care.

One of these services is Primary Children's Medical Psychiatry/Psychology (Med Psych) Program. This service assesses and treats the psychiatric and psychological factors a patient presents with, in the context of their medical condition. We are the only program that offers this service in the Intermountain west region. Another unique aspect of our programming is having full time nurses supporting our Day Treatment services. Working with Primary Children's and McKay Dee Hospital we can provide a full continuum of services from outpatient to crisis stabilization.

Primary Children's Pediatric Behavioral Health Outpatient

Description: Two - Three MSW students within the Outpatient clinic will have the opportunity to practice individual and family therapy with children who are 3 - 18 years old with a range of mental health diagnoses.

Practice Domain: This is predominantly a micro-practice placement with experience in individual and group therapy, and some mezzo-practice opportunities with family therapy and potential for school outreach. For those interested in additional Macro practice, Pediatric Behavioral Health has potential for collaboration opportunities with NAMI, UNI, Community Providers and the Suicide Prevention Initiative.

Supervision & Training: In addition to a dedicated weekly supervision time and regular opportunities for informal supervision from a multidisciplinary team, all Pediatric Behavioral Health interns will participate in weekly didactic seminars, monthly Grand Rounds, online modules and have access to any Primary Children's trainings.

Primary Children's Pediatric Behavioral Health
Child & Adolescent Day Treatment

Description: Two - Four MSW students will have the opportunity to work with a multidisciplinary team to provide brief individual and family therapy to children and adolescents in a full day treatment program that includes time in our on-site accredited school, recreation and expressive therapies, group psychotherapy and therapeutic mealtimes for children who are 5-18 years old. Length of stay for the programs is 6-12 weeks.

Practice Domain: This is predominantly a micro-practice placement with experience in individual and group therapy, and some mezzo-practice opportunities with family therapy and school outreach & planning. For those interested in additional Macro practice, Pediatric Behavioral Health has potential for collaboration opportunities with NAMI, UNI, Community Providers and the Suicide Prevention Initiative.

Supervision & Training: In addition to a dedicated weekly supervision time and regular opportunities for informal supervision from a multidisciplinary team, all Pediatric Behavioral Health interns will participate in weekly didactic seminars, monthly Grand Rounds, online modules and have access to any Primary Children's trainings.

Primary Children's Pediatric Behavioral Health
Inpatient & Crisis

Description: Two MSW students will have the opportunity to rotate through the Pediatric Behavioral Health inpatient unit and hospital-based crisis team. Working with a multidisciplinary team on the inpatient unit, interns will have the opportunity to provide psychosocial assessments, brief individual therapy, case management and process groups for children being stabilized for acute mental health episodes. Working with the Emergency and hospital based team, interns on the Crisis Team will provide crisis evaluation and recommendations for pediatric patients experiencing acute mental health crises who are 4 – 18 years old.

Practice Domain: This is predominantly a micro-practice placement with experience in individual and group therapy, and some mezzo-practice opportunities with family therapy. For those interested in additional Macro practice, Pediatric Behavioral Health has potential for collaboration opportunities with NAMI, UNI, Community Providers and the Suicide Prevention Initiative.

Supervision & Training: In addition to a dedicated weekly supervision time and regular opportunities for informal supervision from a multidisciplinary team, all Pediatric Behavioral Health interns will participate in weekly didactic seminars, monthly Grand Rounds, online modules and have access to any Primary Children's trainings.

Hours of Operation: Flexible and negotiable with supervisor. Nights and weekends available. Each intern will do a single semester rotation on inpatient and crisis.
